MAKE A PLASTIC BOTTLE BIRDFEEDER!


Reuse single-use plastic and help out the birds in your backyard!

What you need:

- 1 plastic bottle (soda, water, sports drink, etc.)
- 3 plastic spoons
- 1 plastic container lid, larger than the base of your bottle
- Craft wire
- Hot glue
- Sharp knife, single-sided razor blade, or scissors
- Electric drill
- Pen or marker

Instructions:

- Cut 3 semicircles into the plastic bottle (see picture for placement). The widest part of the spoons should fit snugly into these holes.
- 3/4 inch beneath each semicircle, cut a hole the width and height of the spoon handle.
- Drill or cut 4 small holes into the bottom edge of the bottle, one on each side.
- Place the bottle in the center of the plastic lid and mark where each small hole is on the lid. Drill small holes in the lid at those points.
- Out off the handle of each spoon.
- Stick one spoon handle 1/4 inch into each hole below a semicircle. Use hot glue to secure them.



OT Stick one spoon scoop into each semicircle and secure it with glue. The side that originally connected to the handle should be 1/2 inch into the bottle, while the "scoop" part sticks out like a bowl.

Thread the wire through the small holes in the bottle and lid to connect them together. Secure by twisting the wire.

Sandwich the top of the bottle (right beneath the cap) with two 10-inch wires.

Twist each side of wire together in a cord.

Arch the two cords above the cap and twist them together to form a handle.
